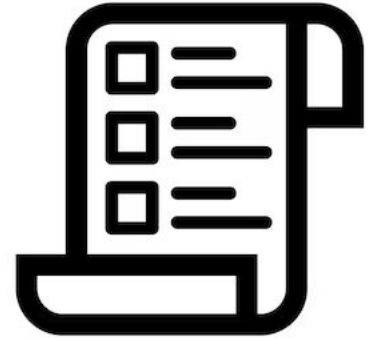


# Berlin olympic games

# 1. Geographic situation

Berlin is the capital of Germany and one of the sixteen German federal states. It is located in the northeast of Germany. The rivers Spree, Havel, Panke, Dahme and Wuhle flow through the city.

With a population of 3.77 million inhabitants, Berlin is the most populous city in the country and Central Europe, as well as the first city in population and the fourth largest urban agglomeration among the countries of the European Union.

Berlin has an oceanic climate the eastern part of the city has a slight influence of a humid continental climate especially in the 0 °C isotherm, being one of the changes the annual precipitation according to the air masses and the higher abundance during a period of the year.

# *High jump*

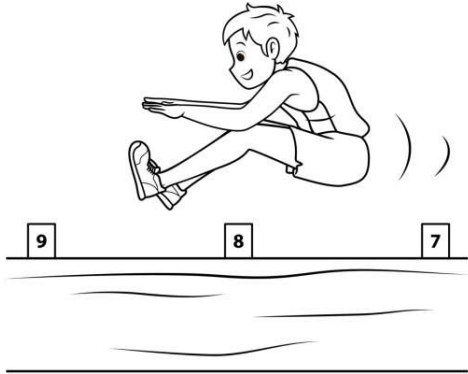
It consists of crossing a horizontal bar placed at a certain height between two vertical supports about four meters apart.





# Long jump

It is a form of athletics that consists of traveling the maximum possible distance in the horizontal plane from a jump after a race.

Canoeing is a nautical sport in which high speeds can be reached. It consists of sailing with canoes or kayaks, propelled by oars by one, two or four crew members.

**Olympiastadion:** Its capacity is for 74,415 people. If the Olympics were celebrated here, numerous sports could be practiced, like: Athletics, relay race, high jump...


**Lanxess Arena:** With a capacity for 20,000 people, it is the biggest sports center in Germany, and here some sports could be celebrated that in the Olympiastadion couldn't, like: ice hockey, handball, curling...

## **Air transportation**

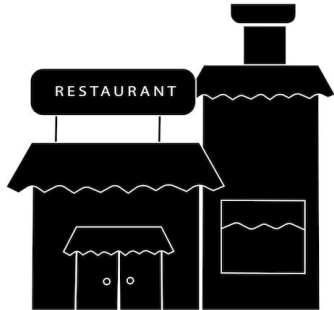
